Swallowed by a giant fish??? We still can't fathom it. This and many other jaw dropping details keep us coming back to Jonah's story for inspiration and exhortation. Let's take a deep look.

The City of Nineveh

Very Large:

[Jonah 3:3](#) (ESV)

... Now Nineveh was an exceedingly great city, three days' journey in breadth.

Very Wicked:

[Nahum 3:1](#) (ESV)

Woe to the bloody city,

all full of lies and plunder—

no end to the prey!

Call of Jonah

Jonah 1:1-2 ESV

Now the word of the LORD came to Jonah the son of Amittai, saying, “Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and call out against it, for their evil has come up before me.”

The Human Viewpoint

- Jonah wondered...
 - hopeless
 - dangerous
 - don't want to go...

Prophets and Kings (Section 2—Prophets of the Northern Kingdom)

As the prophet thought of the difficulties and seeming impossibilities of this commission, he was tempted to question the wisdom of the call. From a human viewpoint it seemed as if nothing could be gained by proclaiming such a message in that proud city. He forgot for the moment that the God whom he served was all-wise and all-powerful. While he hesitated, still doubting, Satan overwhelmed him with discouragement. The prophet was seized with a great dread, and he “rose up to flee unto Tarshish.” Going to Joppa, and finding there a ship ready to sail, “he paid the fare thereof and went down into it, to go with them.” —PK 266

- He believed Satan
 - not God...
- They can't be saved...

[Jonah 1:3](#) (ESV)

But Jonah rose to flee to Tarshish from the presence of the LORD. He went down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish. So he paid the fare and went down into it, to go with them to Tarshish, away from the presence of the LORD.

- Notice
 - why bottom of boat?

“away from the presence of the LORD...”

- Can you get
 - away from Lord
 - bottom of boat?
- Foolish?

- small God...
- God's mission
 - change heart of Ninevites
 - change heart of Prophet!
- Often,
- greatest part ministry
 - save the missionary!

Jonah 1:4-5 ESV

But the LORD hurled a great wind upon the sea, and there was a mighty tempest on the sea, so that the ship threatened to break up. Then the mariners were afraid, and each cried out to his god. And they hurled the cargo that was in the ship into the sea to lighten it for them. But Jonah had gone down into the inner part of the ship and had lain down and was fast asleep.

- Contemplate irony
 - Those innocent
 - not peace
 - Those guilty

- sleeping peacefully.
- Jonah's choices
 - endangering whole ship.

Jonah 1:6 ESV

So the captain came and said to him, “What do you mean, you sleeper? Arise, call out to your god! Perhaps the god will give a thought to us, that we may not perish.”

- Check this out.
- People ready to seek

- God of Jonah for help.

- While Jonah
 - running from God
 - not praying...
 - losing opportunities
 - God will fix that.

- God's name must
 - be glorified!
 - held on high!
 - power honored!

Jonah 1:7 ESV

And they said to one another, "Come, let us cast lots, that we may know on whose account this evil has come upon us." So they cast lots, and the lot fell on Jonah.

- Mariners

- life at sea
- They know
 - not typical storm
 - deadly
 - wrath of God!
- Pagans know
 - God is angry.
- Jonah
 - playing ignorant.
- God allows lot
 - fall on Jonah.

Jonah 1:8-10 ESV

Then they said to him, “Tell us on whose account this evil has come upon us. What is your occupation? And where do you come from? What is your country? And of what people are you?” And he said to them, “I am a Hebrew, and I fear the LORD, the God of heaven, who made the sea and the dry land.” Then the men were exceedingly afraid and said to him, “What is this that you have done!” For the men knew that he was fleeing from the presence of the LORD, because he had told them.

- Interesting Opportunity
 - mission work...???
- Why would you???
 - endangered us all!!!

Jonah 1:11 ESV

Then they said to him, “What shall we do to you, that the sea may quiet down for us?” For the sea grew more and more tempestuous.

- Storm gets worse
- Men are terrified...
 - what should we do?
- They believe
 - more faith than Jonah's
 - How do you worship?
 - How do you appease?

Jonah 1:12-13 ESV

He said to them, "Pick me up and hurl me into the sea; then the sea will quiet down for you, for I know it is because of me that this great tempest has come upon you." Nevertheless, the men rowed hard to get back to dry land, but they could not, for the sea grew more and more tempestuous against them.

- What should we do?
 - Appease Your God's Wrath?
- Throw me into ocean???
 - No
 - Try not.

Jonah 1:14-16 ESV

Therefore they called out to the LORD, “O LORD, let us not perish for this man’s life, and lay not on us innocent blood, for you, O LORD, have done as it pleased you.” So they picked up Jonah and hurled him into the sea, and the sea ceased from its raging. Then the men feared the LORD exceedingly, and they offered a sacrifice to the LORD and made vows.

- They give up
 - realize they can’t save Jonah.
 - without losing their life...

- Prayer of Faith
 - Confession
 - Supplication
 - They are converted!!!

- Jonah...
 - not yet...

- no confession
 - no repentance
 - no sorrow for sin

Jonah 1:17-2:1 ESV

And the LORD appointed a great fish to swallow up Jonah. And Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights.

Then Jonah prayed to the LORD his God from the belly of the fish,

- Jonah finally
 - begins to repent
 - God leads him.

[Jonah 2:10-3:3](#) (ESV)

And the LORD spoke to the fish, and it vomited Jonah out upon the dry land.

Then the word of the LORD came to Jonah the second time, saying, “Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and call out against it the message that I tell you.” So Jonah arose and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD.

- This time Jonah obeyed.
 - willing to give prophecy
 - bad prophecy

[Jonah 3:4](#) (ESV)

... And he called out, “Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!”

- Jonah didn't seem to mind
 - was okay with them dying
 - though they were wicked
 - irreconcilably evil
 - unregenerate.
- But miracle happened

Jonah 3:5 ESV

And the people of Nineveh believed God. They called for a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them to the least of them.

- Whole city repented

Jonah 3:6–10 ESV

The word reached the king of Nineveh, and he arose from his throne, removed his robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes. And he issued a proclamation and published through Nineveh, “By the decree of the king and his nobles: Let neither man nor beast, herd nor flock, taste anything. Let them not feed or drink water, but let man and beast be covered with sackcloth, and let them call out mightily to God. Let everyone turn from his evil way and from the violence that is in his hands. Who knows? God may turn and relent and turn from his fierce anger, so that we may not perish.”

When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil way, God relented of the disaster that he had said he would do to them, and he did not do it.

- Amazing conversion
- They saw
 - full gospel
 - God is powerful.
 - God is merciful.
- Jesus was impressed

- by repentance of
 - city of Nineveh
- Compared them with
 - Israelites of His day.

Matthew 12:41 *ESV*

The men of Nineveh will rise up at the judgment with this generation and condemn it, for they repented at the preaching of Jonah, and behold, something greater than Jonah is here.

- More righteous than Jews
 - they repented
- More righteous than
 - world we live in.
- Continue Story
 - everyone is happy
 - except Jonah.

Jonah 4:1-3 ESV

But it displeased Jonah exceedingly, and he was angry. And he prayed to the LORD and said, “O LORD, is not this what I said when I was yet in my country? That is why I made haste to flee to Tarshish; for I knew that you are a gracious God and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, and relenting from disaster. Therefore now, O LORD, please take my life from me, for it is better for me to die than to live.”

- Why was Jonah mad?
 - He looks like
 - false prophet.
- He is okay with them dying
 - but does want to look bad!!!

Jonah 4:4 ESV

And the LORD said, “Do you do well to be angry?”

- No answer yet.
- Continues...

Jonah 4:5-9 ESV

Jonah went out of the city and sat to the east of the city and made a booth for himself there. He sat under it in the shade, till he should see what would become of the city. Now the LORD God appointed a plant and made it come up over Jonah, that it might be a shade over his head, to save him from his discomfort. So Jonah was exceedingly glad because of the plant. But when dawn came up the next day, God appointed a worm that attacked the plant, so that it withered. When the sun rose, God appointed a scorching east wind, and the sun beat down on the head of Jonah so that he was faint. And he asked that he might die and said, "It is better for me to die than to live." But God said to Jonah, "Do you do well to be angry for the plant?" And he said, "Yes, I do well to be angry, angry enough to die."

- Wow,
 - so bitter...
- Why are you angry?
- God answers:

Jonah 4:10-11 ESV

And the LORD said, "You pity the plant, for which you did not labor, nor did you make it grow, which came into being in a night and perished in a night. And should not I pity Nineveh, that great city, in which there are more than 120,000 persons who do not know their right hand from their left, and also much cattle?"

- you feel pity for plant?

- no pity for
 - 120k people?
- We are similar.
 - surrounded by people.
 - in our way.
- How do you see them?
 - sheep without shepherd?
 - obstacles?
 - mission field?
- Story ends abruptly...
 - what happens.?
- We don't know...
 - maybe God,
 - left unwritten
 - so we could

- finish story...
- Have we been
 - like Jonah...
 - Not caring for lost?
- What will we do?
 - Proclaim gospel of love?
 - Keep to ourselves?
